## Introduction

The Maine Artist Guild Galleries contain a number of artworks that are for sale to raise money for the Davistown Museum. These are interspersed with numerous artworks in the Davistown Museum permanent collection which are not for sale. Art work that is for sale on either the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> floor will be priced in the lower right hand corner of the description. Those items so marked are contained in this catalog under four headings:

- Section 1: Art work consigned to the MAG galleries by participating artists.
- Section 2: Art work from private collections consigned to the Davistown Museum MAG galleries. Numerous lower & mid range priced artworks have been consigned by the Liberty Tool Co. and Captain Tinkham's, and are listed in this section of the catalog.
- Section 3: Items being deaccessioned by the Davistown Museum
- Section 4: Items for sale in the Museum Store

20% of all proceeds from the sale of art works in section 1 & 2 will be donated to the Museum by the participating artists and collectors. 100% of all proceeds from sales in Sections 3 and 4 will be retained by the Museum.

#### **Maine Artists Guild Gallery Complex {2<sup>nd</sup> floor}:**

Most art is located in rooms 1 – 8 in the MAG complex on the second floor of the museum building. Visitors entering the MAG Galleries from the museum stairwell entrance: please note the following: As you enter the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor complex – you will see the library for Center for the Study of Early Tools on your left. This is Room 1 of the gallery complex. As you pass the photography area on the right, you will enter Room 3, where incoming tools are cataloged. Before turning right towards Rooms 4 & 5 and the Museum kitchen (Room 6) and the Museum Café (Room 7), you will note the Library reading room on your left (Room 2). Room 8 – is the hallway on the left side of Room 5. MAG artist's consignments are scattered throughout all these rooms, along with selections from the permanent collection of the Museum. Most items listed in section 4, the Museum Store (MS) are located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor next to the receptionist's desk. There are a few Museum store items, including Museum publications and books by Museum artists such as Alan Magee for sale in the Museum Café and in Rooms 2 & 4.

**All art for sale, including art consigned from private collections, includes a price on the lower right side of the label.** If the item has no

price, the artwork is part of the permanent collection or is on loan from an artist participating in our annual art exhibition. **Visitors please note the Museum Café is located in the rear of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and has coffee, tea, and snacks for sale.** When weather permits, we have a great outside porch where visitors to the Museum, Liberty Graphics or Liberty Tool Co. may bring a picnic lunch. Please see the person on duty if you would like to purchase any items consigned to the MAG Galleries, or purchase any of the artwork on display Museum affiliated artists. While visiting the Museum, don't forget to visit the Liberty Graphics outlet store on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor, which is famous throughout Maine for its reasonable prices.

**Third floor exhibition area:**

Only a few of the items on the third floor main hall are for sale and are labeled as such, with prices in the lower right hand corner. See below for guide to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor which is labeled by letters rather than numbers to avoid confusion with the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor gallery spaces. In section 2 of this gallery guide, a number of paintings are located in a restricted area at the Hulls Cove office {located 75 miles from the Liberty Museum complex} and may be viewed by appointment only. Please contact the curator for more information on these paintings. The code POR means price on request.

The Maine Artist Guild is comprised of living artists with work in the permanent collection of the Davistown Museum. Many thanks to the artists participating in the Guild and for their support of the Museum.

Visitors please note: In the Davistown Museum/MAG Gallery Haystack Mountain Café, numerous books and postcards are for sale, along with coffee, tea, chocolates, etc. 20% of all Café sales are also donated to the Museum. Please note, the Museum kitchen is for staff use and Museum functions: our café is only licensed to serve beverages and packaged snacks. During art openings, however, wine may be served to gallery visitors in Rooms 2 & 3. After 5 p.m. on Friday and Saturday nights – Rooms 1 ~ 3 and the Main exhibition hall on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor are open until 10 p.m.; visitors entering this restricted area are charged a \$5 admission fee if they are not Museum members or participating artists. Otherwise a suggested donation of \$2 is welcomed during regular Museum hours.
